Pre-school experience

- 1. a) The percentage of children for whom a place was requested who are:
 - i) in their pre-school year
 - ii) 3-year-olds in the year before their pre-school year

- b) The percentage of these grant-aided children who received fewer than five education sessions per week during the period they were eligible:
 - i) pre-school year children

What the indicator reports

Pre-school education is provided to children who are eligible for government grant aided expenditure. This indicator shows the extent to which the service is provided and by whom, for those children whose parents wish them to receive pre-schooling.

Points to bear in mind

In addition to councils there are other providers of this service:

- Private a nursery or playgroup managed by a company or business as a private business, and also includes childminders
- Independent a nursery class which is part of an independent school
- Voluntary a nursery or playgroup run on a non-profit basis

Guidance on the planning of pre-school education and childcare and the establishment of childcare partnerships, issued by the then SOEID in October 1998, identifies a government policy goal to:

"secure a quality part-time pre-school education place for (a) every pre-school year child whose parents want one by the winter of 1998/99; and (b) for every three-year-olds whose parents what a place by 2002"

Factors affecting the number of sessions received by children will include:

- parents' preferences they may prefer that their children, particularly three-year-olds, attend for less than five sessions per week
- councils' policies particularly where capacity is tight, councils may offer children, again particularly three-year-olds, a place with fewer than five sessions per week.

All providers of government grant-funded places are registered and inspected against quality standards and are required to follow the curriculum framework for three to five-year olds.

Primary schools

- 2: Class size
 - a) The number and percentage of classes which fall within the following categories
 - i) single-year classes with 33 or fewer pupils
 - ii) composite classes with 25 or fewer pupils
 - iii) classes with P1 to P3 pupils that have 30 pupils or less.
 - b) The total number of primary school classes of each type: single-year, composite, and those with P1 to P3 pupils.

What the indicator reports

Maximum class sizes are subject to a national agreement in Scotland: the maximum for single-year classes is 33, and for composite classes it is 25 pupils. The government is encouraging councils to reduce the class size for classes containing pupils in classes P1 to P3, to no more than 30 pupils.

This indicator shows the proportions of classes meeting these standards in primary schools. It also shows the extent to which each council uses composite classes, and the total number of primary school classes of each type.

Composite classes are those where at least two year groups (eg Primary 4 and 5) are taught in the same teaching area or class at the same time. Councils use composite classes where there are low numbers of pupils or where the school has to adjust class sizes in accordance with the number of available teachers.

Points to bear in mind

Changes in the number of children starting school each year will result in some variation between years in:

- · the total number of classes
- the balance between composite and single-year classes.

The extent to which composite classes are used as a means of increasing average class size is a matter of policy for each council.

- 3. a) Occupancy: the percentage of primary schools where the ratio of pupils to places is:
 - 40% or less
 - 41-60%
 - 61-80%
 - 81-100%
 - 101% or more.
 - b) The total number of primary schools

What the indicator reports

This indicator shows the proportion of each council's primary schools within the four occupancy bands shown.

The occupancy level is a measure of how many of the places available for pupils in a school have been taken up. For example, if a school has 150 places and 120 are filled, the occupancy level is 80%. Each council determines the number of places that are available in its schools.

Points to bear in mind

The calculation of occupancy level depends on the way in which a school's capacity is determined. Councils have some discretion in this area and there may, therefore, be minor differences between the ways they determine capacity. Some of the factors which may be important are:

- whether or not gymnasiums are counted as teaching rooms
- · how non-teaching rooms are treated

- the treatment of rooms used for only part of the curriculum
- whether surplus accommodation is given over to community and other use and is no longer treated as available for school use.

The variation in the number of primary schools among councils means that a small percentage of schools in a large council may represent more schools than a high percentage in a small council. For example, 10% of primary schools in Glasgow is 20, whilst 50% in Moray is 23 schools.

Secondary schools

- 4. a) Occupancy: the percentage of secondary schools where the ratio of pupils to places is:
 - 40% or less
 - 41-60%
 - 61-80%
 - 81-100%
 - 101% or more.
 - b) The total number of secondary schools

What the indicator reports

This indicator shows the proportion of each council's secondary schools within the four bands shown.

The occupancy level is a measure of how many of the places available for pupils in a school have been taken up. For example, if there are 800 places and 600 are filled, the occupancy level is 75%. Each council determines the number of places that are available in its schools.

Points to bear in mind

The calculation of occupancy level depends on the way in which a school's capacity is determined. Councils have some discretion in this area and there may, therefore, be minor differences between the ways they determine capacity. Some of the factors which may be important are:

- · whether or not gymnasiums are counted as teaching rooms
- · how non-teaching rooms are treated
- the treatment of rooms used for only part of the curriculum
- whether surplus accommodation is given over to community and other use and is no longer treated as available for school use.

The variation in the number of secondary schools between councils means that a small percentage of schools in a large council may represent more schools than a high percentage in a small council. For example, 50% of secondary schools in North Lanarkshire is 13, whilst 100% in Angus is eight schools.

Special educational needs

- 5. The average time taken to complete assessments of special educational needs, and the percentage completed within the following time bands:
 - · up to 18 weeks
 - 19 to 26 weeks
 - 27 to 39 weeks
 - 40 to 52 weeks
 - more than 1 year.
 - average time for completion of all assessments

What the indicator reports

An assessment of a pupil's special educational needs may be required as a result of a child having a learning difficulty, physical disability, psychological disturbance, or any combination of these. These needs cannot normally be met from the resources ordinarily available in schools.

This indicator reports the average time it takes each council to carry out assessments of children who may have special educational needs, and the percentages assessments completed within each of the time bands.

Following an assessment, the council must notify the child's parent or guardian as to whether or not it intends to record the child as having special educational needs, and the reasons for its decision.

The council is obliged to provide for the special educational needs of a child for whom it creates a record of need.

Points to bear in mind

The key factors which influence this indicator are:

- the efficiency of professional and administrative input
- the number and complexity of the referrals received.

In some cases, a longer time for completion of the assessment is pre-planned. This occurs when:

- an assessment is delayed to accommodate a change in a child's circumstances or personal development; for example, when a child is approaching the move from primary to secondary school, the assessment may be timed to coincide with this event
- a longer time to complete an assessment is negotiated with the parents or guardian of a child, or stems from a request by them for a delay.

Children being looked after - academic attainment

6: The number and percentage of young people of age 16 or 17, ceasing to be looked after away from home, who achieved Standard Grades in English and Maths or other subjects:

What the indicator reports

This indicator reflects how well councils meet the targets established by the Scottish Executive and provide for the educational needs of young people in their care who are looked after away from home.

This indicator refers only to those young people who ceased to be cared for during the year who were 16 or 17 years of age.

Points to bear in mind

The Scottish Executive has established a target that for the educational attainment of young people leaving care where they identify that young people should have achieved both English and Maths at standard grade.

The Standard Grades refer to all levels from 1 to 6 as per the Scottish Qualification Authority examinations structure.

Teaching staff - equal opportunities

7: The number and percentage of head and deputy head teachers who are women compared with the percentage of all teachers that are women.

What the indicator reports

The delivery of quality services is dependent on a trained and motivated workforce and it is, therefore essential that councils' employment policies reflect their commitment to equal opportunities. The indicator provides a picture of the current gender balance in promoted teaching posts, in relation to the overall gender balance within the profession in different types of school.

The indicator does not deal with equalities relating to ethnicity, disability or sexual orientation.

Points to bear in mind

The indicator includes all posts involved in direct teaching in a school, providing teaching services directly to pupils/students. This includes peripatetic teachers, support for learning teachers, visiting specialists, home tutors, guidance teachers, assistant head teachers, depute head teachers and head teachers.

Child protection

- 8: a) The number of children referred over the 12 months to 31 March
 - b) The percentage of children entered on the register in the year who had previously been on the register
 - c) The number of children on the council's child protection register at 31 March
 - d) The number of children on the child protection register at 31 March per 1,000 population aged under 16 years
 - e) The percentage of children on the register at 31 March who had been on the register for:
 - i) less than 6 months
 - ii) 6 months but under one year
 - iii) one year but under 2 years
 - iv) two years or more.

What the indicator reports

The indicator provides information on the scale of the child protection work undertaken by each council, in responses to allegations of child neglect, or physical, sexual or emotional abuse.

Points to bear in mind

Not all referrals will result in the child's name being added to the register, an action which reflects suspected or actual risk to the child.

The success or failure of child protection work cannot easily be measured statistically and the indicator is not intended to measure performance directly. Rather, it assists Councils to assess their performance by provoking questions. For example, it is recognised by councils as good practice that a child's name should not remain on the child protection register any longer than is necessary. While a long registration period may be required for a particular child, the extent to which a high proportion of children remain on the register for long periods raises questions about whether a council is resolving the underlying risks which led to registration.

Similarly, the re-registration of a particular child previously on the Child Protection Register may be justified by changes in home circumstances. However, high levels of re-registration may indicate that the child protection process was not effective previously in preventing or reducing the risk of child abuse.

A very high or very low number of children on the child protection register per 1,000 child population compared with other authorities is as likely to reflect differences in child protection, registration and de-registration policy and procedures, as it is to reflect differences in the prevalence of child abuse, and therefore may indicate that current policy and practice should be reviewed.

The separate parts of the indicator should be considered together. For example, a high reregistration rate is likely to reduce the time children registered at 31 March have been on the register, since for practical reasons the latter is measured from the commencement of the current episode.

The indicator will be affected by:

- the level of awareness (eg by social work staff, teachers, relatives, neighbours, police) of child abuse and its identification
- the level of resources available for preventative work with families
- child protection, registration and de-registration policy and procedures.

Looked after children

9: The number and percentage of children being looked after by the council in the following types of placement:

What the indicator reports

This indicator reports the extent to which councils have been able to arrange placements for children at home or in the community, as contrasted with residential placements.

It also reports the number of children being looked after expressed as a rate per 1,000 population of young people aged 0 - 17 years within the council's area, and within this group the number of children under 12, excluding those receiving respite care that are looked after.

The indicator also reports all other children not included in any of the other categories who receive respite care.

'At home' means the child is under supervision by the council and living at home with parent(s) or guardian(s).

'Other community placements' comprise placements with relatives or friends, with foster parents, with prospective adopters, or in private lodgings.

'Residential accommodation' comprises children's homes, secure units, residential schools, special schools, assessment centres, hospitals, hostels and other forms of residential accommodation.

Points to bear in mind

The factors most likely to affect the placing of children are:

- the success of the council in supporting parents and guardians of children supervised at home
- the extent to which councils have been able to identify, develop and support a range of other community placements
- the types of care needed by the children for whom the council was responsible. Community
 placements are not always appropriate. Residential care may be more suitable in certain
 cases, based on an assessment of the best interests of the child
- the council's policies for example, the number of children's homes and other residential places which the council considers it desirable to retain (or to use, where these are not run by the council).

Generally, councils are successful in finding community placements where appropriate, particularly for younger children. Those children remaining in residential care tend to be adolescents and are more difficult to place in the community.

10: Staff qualifications: The percentage of care staff in local authority residential children's homes, who have appropriate care qualifications.

What the indicator reports

This indicator reports a key aspect of the quality of residential care. The extent to which care staff have appropriate qualifications is one of a number of factors which contribute to the quality of residential care, but it is significant.

Points to bear in mind

The indicator will be affected by:

- the policies of councils on recruiting staff who are suitably qualified, and on training existing staff
- the availability of suitably qualified staff.

The indicator relates only to staff in residential homes managed by councils. Voluntary and private sector homes are not included.

11: Privacy: The number of single rooms and the number of rooms with en-suite facilities, expressed as a percentage of all residential care places for children, used by the council.

What the indicator reports

Research on the preferences of residents in residential establishments shows that privacy is of particular importance. Therefore, the indicator measures this particular aspect of the quality of the residential care.

The indicator is based on the number of bedrooms intended solely for one person, and excludes rooms which have two or more beds but are used by only one person.

En-suite facilities will have as a minimum a shower or bath in the apartment for the sole use of the resident, but it should be recognised that many homes, but not all, will provide a higher standard than this.

Points to bear in mind

The indicator is likely to be affected by:

- limitations in the resources available to councils and the owners of homes in the voluntary and private sectors to improve homes by increasing the number of single rooms
- the physical layout of an existing home, which may limit the scope for creating single rooms
- design standards for new homes which encourage greater provision of single rooms it is desirable for councils to use some double rooms to accommodate young siblings.

Respite care

- 12: a) For children with disabilities receiving respite care away from home, the number of respite care bed-nights per 1,000 children age 0 17,
 - b) For children with disabilities receiving respite care at home, the number of respite care hours per 1,000 children age 0 17,

What the indicator reports

Respite care is a support for the carer(s) of vulnerable children, supplying temporary relief from the responsibility of providing care, by the provision of alternative care. Often the purpose of respite care is to prevent a breakdown in care in the household, which results in the child having to be admitted to permanent care. Respite care may, therefore, be provided on a planned or an emergency basis.

Respite care can take various forms, such as admission to residential care for the child, 'sitter' services, 'share-the-care' and 'breaks-and-opportunities' schemes.

The number of bed-nights and hours provided or purchased provides a measure of the total volume of respite care provided or purchased and comparison can be made between the level of provision amongst councils.

Points to bear in mind

The indicator will be affected primarily by:

- the volume of requests for assessment for respite care and the pattern of services required
- · the availability of respite care
- the priority given by the council to the development of respite care.

The indicator does not take account of the nature of the service provided or the number of episodes of respite care which a child may have received.

Children's panel liaison

- 13: Social background reports:
 - a) the number of reports submitted to the Reporter during the year
 - b) the proportion of reports requested by the Reporter which were submitted within 20 days

What the indicator reports

This indicator shows how well councils are meeting the national standard time for submitting social background reports to the Reporter.

Points to bear in mind

The National Standard is that all social work reports will be submitted to the Reporter "within 20 working days of the date of the request".

14: Supervision:

- a) the number of new supervision requirements made during the year
- b) the proportion of children seen by a supervising officer within 15 days.

What the indicator reports

This indicator shows how well councils are meeting the national target time for allocating a social worker (supervising officer) and arranging for a visit to the child/family to take place as the first step in the programme of work with the child.

The National Standard is that "the local authority will give effect to supervision requirements with no condition of residence within 15 days of date of issue by the children's hearing"

Points to bear in mind

The indicator **excludes** those cases where the hearing imposes a condition of residence on the child. That is, where the child is placed in some form of residential establishment or required to stay at a specific address away from home (eg. with a grandparent).

Children's services

Auditors appointed by the Accounts Commission have reviewed councils' arrangements for producing the performance information. In the table below, an 'x' is shown against an indicator where the auditor expressed doubts about the reliability of the authority's arrangements for producing the information.
